THE PROBLEM

Some of our students struggle to follow along with grade level books. They may be able to comprehend the story, but the physical act of reading may prevent a student from being successful.

THE SOLUTION

We have been able to use Audiobooks as a solution for these students. Students are still given a physical book but are then "Title Assigned" an audiobook version. They can follow along with the physical book while listening to the story. It also allows the teacher to work with individual students instead of reading the book aloud to the students. With Title Assignments I am able to assign a book to a student for extended periods of time without worrying about the title being returned before they are finished. Holds do not interfere with their ability to complete the story!

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
